## **Tonbridge Masters Update 5th December 2019**

## Kent Masters Cross Country Championships 30th November

These championships are always unpredictable, as the nature of Masters athletics means that injuries will often change the line up from year to year. Yet again the M50's opened the events and Ben Reynolds took on this year's challengers as he successfully defended his title. A group of 5 forged away from the field and it was towards the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> lap that it started to become a race between Ben and Stephen Male from Folkstone, there was still only about 20m in it as they turned for the final 250m with Ben holding on to a 4 second win.

The team race was so tight throughout and finished with TAC and Maidstone & Medway tied on 19 points, as Richard Newbold 7th showed great form, with Phil Coleman 11<sup>th</sup> close in the 3<sup>rd</sup> scoring position. They were both in battles with the M&M 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> scorers, but unfortunately could not overcome them, with the result that M&M won the title on count back for the higher 3<sup>rd</sup> placed scorer.

Behind this leading bunch Mark PK finished 2 places higher than last year in 17<sup>th</sup>, Michael Thomson 27<sup>th</sup>, Tobin 29<sup>th</sup> easing his hamstring up the steep banks and Andy Wood in 41st. We would still have secured silver team with anyone of these in 3<sup>rd</sup> scorer position. Cain will be happy to move up an Age group next year.





The Women's race was dominated by two athletes from Dulwich including multiple W55 world record holder Clare Elms, who impressively finshed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall. However the TAC W35 squad were well grouped with Liz Weeks 3<sup>rd</sup>, Claire day 4<sup>th</sup> and Nichola Evans 9<sup>th</sup>. This secured the team win for the first time ever. Kim Cross had her best ever Cross Country race as she filled the insurance spot as 4<sup>th</sup> TAC runner (we would have won with her as 3<sup>rd</sup> scorer) Pearl Pearce is growing into these XC races and the course suited her well for 29<sup>th</sup>.

The W45 team also won the title led by Tina Oldershaw 2<sup>nd</sup>, with a determined run from Nina Ridge 5<sup>th</sup> and Rachel Fagg 16<sup>th</sup> overhauling an injured Lisa Knight 17<sup>th</sup> towards the end. This was a much closer score with only 6 points separating us from Beckenham.







Ross Kinloch had a great race in the M60 to win the title as he finished just 6 seconds down on Liz weeks, he was 5<sup>th</sup> M60 towards the end of the first large lap, but a lap later was had pulled out a winning lead of 11 seconds. Unfortunately, Brian Buckwell suffered an injury leaving Alan Newman to finish 23<sup>rd</sup> in an incomplete team.

Sue James won the W65 category, with a winning margin of just under 30 seconds.

The final race was the M40 over the same course as the M50 race. There was a high class scrap at the front, but from a TAC point of view the interest was how our 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> runners were faring against the Dulwich final scorer. Tony Bennett had led the team home and still been able to compute what was going on in the team standings. Nick Arnott had a

strong second half to the race in 25th with Dan Madams 26<sup>th</sup> and James Beeston 32<sup>nd</sup> doing enough to secure the Bronze team medal from Dulwich.



There was a debut for Mark Raymond who stuck to his guns in a fast field and did well as he is at the top of the age group and was experiencing his first XC race for the club.
