Final Kent XC League Race 2018-19 - Norman Park, Bromley - Saturday, 9th February

"How embarrassing. He's not over-70 yet". This was the comment, caught on video, of team manager Mark Hookway as I took advantage of the delayed start to my race at Norman Park by putting in final warm up strides near the finish, only to be mistaken by an official and waved urgently towards the funnel where the women's and men's 70+ race was concluding!

Serves me right for being facetious earlier and asking a nervous looking Maria Heslop if the tinted lenses she was sporting were, in fact, Google glasses, complete with course map and directions! I was only trying to help the defending champion relax in the final few minutes before an epic battle for a potential third successive title; her second as a Tonbridge athlete.

In the event there was no need for any route finding assistance as Cas Wright, of Dartford Harriers, set a furious pace on a well marked and marshalled course, that was far tougher than it looked, due to a howling gale and a few muddy sections in the woodlands loop.

Our reigning champion started the final race with a single point advantage over clubmate Sian Robertson, who ran the perfect race to overhaul the leader to win by just four seconds, snatching the overall trophy from Maria's grasp by a point. The holder did not give up her silverware lightly, though, and ran as hard as she possibly could with a recent injury. The final destination of the magnificent Cliff Temple Memorial Trophy was in doubt until Sian took the lead. Any lesser result would have meant victory for Maria, who had the superior record (a tie would have been resolved on aggregate finish times).



There was some great running a little further down the field as Claire Day (6th), Sasha Houghton (11th) and Tina Oldershaw (16th) ran themselves into winning team positions. Sasha and Tina joined Maria in collecting W45 age-group awards and new member, Liz Weeks (9th) was runner-up to Maria in Masters overall. There was a close battle for the W65 title as the holder, Sue James, was six seconds behind champion Barbara Ockendon (Istead & Ifield Harriers) after passing her rival several times mid-race. In the M70 race held in conjunction with the women's 5.5K race, Maurice Marchant (6th) finished third overall.

Elise Rendall showed her experience as she moved through the field and Nichola Evans is pleased to see the back of the cross country season!

In contrast the men's race, which featured three tours round the 1,000m muddy woodland loop, was less productive in terms of awards, with only Dan Madams making the podium with a bronze finish in the M40 category (the lowest age group recognised). Julian Rendall (11th) made the winning team of six with a storming run, seemingly hardly affected by the blustery wind – perhaps he found some strapping younger men to shelter behind!

Dan produced a fine run for 30th and Steve Keywood (72nd) had to work hard to stay ahead of the three musketeers: Mark P-K, Adam Styles and Tobin Bird – separated by 8 seconds.
