### TAC Masters Update 1at May 2017

## League Opening Fixture at Norman Park Friday 28<sup>th</sup> April



I am sure a number of you like me were unsure of how we would do in Div 1, on paper we looked like we could compete but it was great to see both the Men and Women perform so well to be  $2^{nd}$  equal and  $3^{rd}$  respectively on the night.

The women started the night on the track with Emma Wood showing her class to win the A string 400m by some distance in 60.00. Nina Ridge then followed this up with a beautifully timed finish to win the B string as she came from some way back to pip the tiring Dartford runner. Lucy PK W50 and Nicky Buckwell W60 both picked up 3<sup>rd</sup> place finishes.

The men started with Simon Fraser narrowly beaten into 2<sup>nd</sup> place in a thrilling race. Both Mark McAllister 4<sup>th</sup> and Steve Brooks 6th showed their pace in the first 200m but were overhauled in the final straight.

Meanwhile in the field Pete Ebbage was winning the M50 pole vault and Ian Crawley, despite clearing 2.60m finished 4<sup>th</sup>.

The ladies hammer is a tough event for us as our throwers are all novices and was not helped as team manager (me!) had used last year's team sheets that did not include W60, so Nicky Buckwell was suddenly required to throw.

The Women's 3k produced yet another exciting race as Sasha Houghton took the race on from the start in her bid for the W40 club record. Although tracked by the Dartford A string for the final 4 laps she refused to be passed and showed great pace to pull away and break the record (11.41.90) Not far behind but well clear in W50 was Lucy PK (12.06.30) Rachael Fagg making her league debut, more than equipped her herself by taking 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the B string W35 race, 50 secs clear of 3<sup>rd</sup> in 12.45.20.

Simon Fraser ran his customary well timed 3k (after his lactic 400m) coming through well to be 3<sup>rd</sup> in the A string with Andy Howey running down an age group from the M50 still taking 2<sup>nd</sup> in the B string in

9.56.8. There was a squad of non scorers to support Alan Buckle in the M50 race, but in reality after Ian Crawley shot off to be pace setter for the first 200m, neither Mark PK or Antony Crush could get ahead of Alan to be of much assistance!! He was a comfortable 2<sup>nd</sup> in the M50.

Meanwhile in the Mens triple jump there was very little between the teams apart from the leading two jumpers in the M35. Mark McAllister and Jason Cannon both picked up 5<sup>th</sup> places.

Mark Davies made a return to club action after many years in the Hammer. He is a specialist in Discus and Shot, so to come 3<sup>rd</sup> in the M35 after very little training was impressive. Mark will be leading Shot and Discus sessions on Tuesdays and Thursdays over the following weeks, so anyone wanting assistance can join in with his groups. Pete Ebbage was also 3<sup>rd</sup> in the M50.

The women finished with the Triple Jump and in the W35 the difference between 1<sup>st</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> was only 90cm, a frustrated Nina Ridge is determined to move up the rankings next time. Lucy was 4<sup>th</sup> improving on last years W50 effort. Nicky Buckwell fared better with 3<sup>rd</sup> in the W60 6.44m

In the 5M, Mark PK was 2<sup>nd</sup> Male overall in a time of 30.43 (pleasingly 40 secs faster than 2 years ago!) Tony Bennett was 4<sup>th</sup> Male, having equipped himself with a pair of illustrious pace makers in Mark Steinle (Sydney 2000 Olympics GB marathon runner) and Alan Lee (former Tac ) Along with Fraser Gordon U15 and Vita Milana U17 they won the team medal. Richard Puxty took 1<sup>st</sup> M50 award and Brian Buckwell was 1<sup>st</sup> M60.



Sasha Houghton continued her good form to be 4<sup>th</sup> Lady, 1<sup>st</sup> W40, with Lucy PK 1<sup>st</sup> W50 in 5<sup>th</sup> place.

At the time of writing this there are no results up but there were plenty of other TAC vets running and with the relays coming up in 3 weeks it was very pleasing to see Tony Cohen, Nina Ridge, Cain Bradley, John Ridge and Di Bradley all having good runs. Di will probably be kindly stepping into the shoes of the

injured Maria Heslop for the W45 team and showed she is as determined as ever! She also got the biggest cheer of the day as she finished. Angie Crush made her debut for TAC on the road, to follow her Friday night league debut.

# TAC Open Meeting
